The following constitutes the Duck Valley Conservation District's Annual Plan of Work for the 2017 fiscal year.

Mission Statement

To take available technical, financial and educational resources, whatever their source, and focus or coordinate them so they meet the needs of the local land user for conservation of soil, water and related resources.

Planning and Service

Provide for involvement of other agencies, organizations and individuals in the annual planning and implementation of district operations and programs.

- A. Identify and prioritize resource concerns within the District in order to coordinate with the NRCS in resource planning and program implementation.
- B. Assist USDA/NRCS on outreach programs to ensure that all land users are aware of available technical and financial assistance.
- C. Provide information to the public regarding the Farm Bill and State Legislation that may impact Duck Valley Conservation District and/or local producers.
- D. Provide technical assistance to assignment holders on planning and implementation of conservation practices and plans.
- E. Assist is implementing Farm Bill programs when requested by cooperators.
- F. Manage the District equipment program for benefit of cooperators in implementing conservation practices.
- G. Cooperate with other agencies on water quality and quantity problems when identified within the District.
- H. Actively assist the Shoshone-Paiute Tribes Pesticide Program.
- I. Attend and participate in the Intertribal Ag Council Annual Symposium.
- J. Assist and work with the UNR Cooperative Extension Indian Reservation Program coordinators.
- K. Utilize CAT Challenger to assist the District in helping local farmers and ranchers put acres back into production on the Duck Valley Indian Reservation.
- L. Participate as a cooperating agency with the BLM and Forest Service.
- M. Collaborate with the State of Nevada Sagebrush Ecosystem Council on projects for habitat preservation and restoration.

Information and Education Program

- A. Sponsor participants from the District requesting attendance to the annual Range Camp.
- B. Continue with the Duck Valley CD Scholarship program.
- C. Provide assistance to Owyhee Combined School within the District on conservation education as requested, including supporting the NDF/FFA plant sale.

Management and Administration

- A. Hold regular meetings to which all cooperating agencies and public are invited (in accordance with NRS 241.020-3(b)).
- B. Submit all reports and financial statements to the Nevada Division of Conservation Districts by their respective due dates.
- C. Review Memorandums of Agreements and other documents requiring annual review with cooperating agencies each year.
- D. Provide representation at the NvACD, ECACD and other meetings to keep supervisors informed on all activities affecting the district and provide input for decision making for locally led conservation.
- E. Pay dues to NvACD, NACD and the Elko County Association of Conservation Districts.
- F. Contact elected representatives as needed to provide support and funding for the resource management concerns.
