PLANNING AND SERVICE

- A. The District continued support for the current Farm Bill.
- B. The Noxious Weed Control Program was continued with the following Federal and State agencies to combat the spread of noxious weeds: United States Forest Service, Bureau of Land Management, Nevada Department of Agriculture, Humboldt Watershed Cooperative Weed Management Area, and private individuals.
- C. A cost share program for weed abatement within the District continued.
- D. Continued the biological control program for leafy spurge, Canada thistle, and spotted knapweed. The leafy spurge areas were monitored and were found to have a significant impact to the plants on the hillsides. This project will continue to be monitored for success with the potential to expand in the future.
- E. Memorandums of Agreement were continued with Federal Natural Resource Management Agencies, State of Nevada Agencies, and Elko County.
- F. Continued the operation and maintenance of the Lamoille Rancher's Center.

INFORMATION AND EDUCATION ACTIVITIES

- A. Assisted the Humboldt Watershed Cooperative Weed Management Area group with distributing information to the public regarding noxious weeds.

MANAGEMENT AND ADMINISTRATION ACTIVITIES

- A. Paid dues to the Nevada Association of Conservation Districts and National Association of Conservation Districts.
- B. Held the required number of conservation district meetings during the year.

- C. Meeting notices were posted in accordance with the state open meeting law.

- E. Meeting minutes and reports were submitted to the Nevada State Conservation Commission.
- F. The Memorandum of Understanding with Natural Resources Conservation Service was continued. The Supervisors reviewed the Civil Rights policy and posted a notice in the Elko office.
- G. Maintained contact with the Elko County Commission relating to Conservation District concerns.
- H. Operation of the Lamoille Rancher's Center for community benefit as a meeting place continued. Solicited cooperation from community organizations to assist with maintenance needs for the center.

Annual Plan of Work Lamoille Conservation District Fiscal Year 2022

(Approved)

The following constitutes the Lamoille Conservation District Annual Plan of Work for the 2022 Fiscal Year (July 1, 2021 – June 30, 2022).

Planning and Service

Provide for involvement of other agencies, organization and individuals in the annual planning and implementation of district operations and programs.

- a. Participate in the implementation of an updated Memorandum of Agreement for a cooperative countywide noxious weed program and participate in the Humboldt River Watershed Weed Management Area Plan.
- b. Continue implementation of the Lamoille Noxious weed control program.
- c. Continue cost share program for weed abatement within the District.
- d. Coordinate with the Humboldt Watershed Cooperative Weed Management Area.
- e. Provide support for upcoming Farm Bill Programs.
- f. Continue cooperation with all agencies on water quality problems when identified within the District.
- g. Manage the district equipment program for benefit of cooperators in implementing conservation practices.
- h. Continue the operation plan for the Equipment program using the Government Surplus Program to acquire equipment purchases when possible.
- i. Develop an equipment fund for future equipment purchases.
- j. Provide technical assistance to land users on planning and implementation of conservation practices.
- k. Assist NRCS on outreach programs to insure that all land users are aware of available assistance.
- l. Support the Northeastern Nevada Stewardship Group with their projects.
- m. Collaborate with NDOW Habitat Division.
- n. Collaborate with the State of Nevada Sagebrush Ecosystem Council on projects for habitat preservation and restoration. Participate with the Local Area Working Group.
- o. Continue Stewardship of the Lamoille Rancher's Center in cooperation with other users.
- p. Support the annual meeting of the Nevada Association of Conservation Districts.

Information and Education Program

- a. Sponsor participants to the annual Range Camp or donate funds for infrastructure.
- b. Provide assistance to schools within the District on conservation education as requested.
- c. Support the Silver Sage FFA Alumni Chapter for a scholarship program.
- d. Cooperate with the Humboldt Watershed CWMA on various projects.
- e. Support the Great Basin College Agriculture Department, possible site for conducting educational programs.

Management and Administration

- a. Pay dues to the Nevada Association of Conservation Districts and the National Association of Conservation Districts.
- b. Pay dues to the Elko County Association of Conservation Districts.
- c. Hold regular meetings to which all cooperating agencies are invited.
- d. Submit all reports and financial statements to the Nevada Conservation District Program by their due date.
- e. Review Memorandums of Agreements with cooperating agencies each year.
- f. Provide representation at the NvACD and other meetings to keep supervisors informed on all activities affecting the district and provide input for decision making for locally led conservation.
- g. Contact elected representatives as needed to provide support and funding for the resource management concerns.
