Project Name: Walker River Watershed Noxious Weed Removal

The Smith Valley and Mason Valley Conservation Districts began a multiyear noxious weed inventory and treatment project along the East, West and Walker Rivers in April 2009. Field technicians record infestation data to determine trends and effectiveness. Data recorded include infestation location using GPS coordinates (in NAD 83 UTM Zone 11N), species identification, phenological stage, abundance, distribution, gross infested area, treatment technique used for chemical application, ground cover, ground disturbance, if treatment was applied and also land ownership. Infestation data is kept in GIS. This data is for public review upon request.

In the fall of 2019, Mason Valley Conservation District (MVCD) received a grant from the US Forest Service Resource Advisory Committee to continue this multi-year project. The RAC had not met since 2017, so this funding was crucial to maintain the year-to-year continuity of this vital work. The agreement was not finalized until March, 2020, and the COVID 19 Pandemic shut down operations, so no money was spent in FY 19-20

On September 3, 2019, the Mason Valley Conservation District approved the Annual Report and Final Financial Report. Through the course of the year, the board approved the Resource Needs Assessment (RNA), a WaterSMART Grant from the Bureau of Reclamation for improvements on the Campbell Canal, as well as the Annual Budget. Greg Hunewill, Lyon County Commissioner member passed away on August 19, 2019. Jay Dini was appointed by the Governor to the County Commission, and to the Conservation District Board by the Board of Commissioners. On December 17, 2019, the Board approved forwarding a proposal to the Lyon County Board of Commissioners for the Mason Valley Conservation District to assume the duties of the Walker River Weed Control District. Currently the Weed District is a function of Lyon County.

On January 21, 2020, the Mason Valley Conservation District held a joint annual meeting with the Smith Valley Conservation District at the Heyday Inn in Smith Valley. The meeting was well attended, and featured guest speaker Zachary Ormsby, Conservation Districts Program Manager who spoke on funding opportunities available to Conservation Districts.

MVCD held regular business meetings on:

August 20, 2019, September 3, 2019, October 1, 2019, December 17, 2019, January 21, 2020, March 24, 2020, May 26, 2020 and June 23, 2020.

Project Name: Invenergy Invasive Weeds

Invenergy Inc. completed construction on their 50 megawatt solar energy plant just northwest of Luning, Nevada in January, 2016. As part of the agreement with the Bureau of Land Management (BLM), Invenergy Inc. contributed \$140,000 for noxious and invasive weed inventory and treatment. MVCD was asked to administer the funds among agreement signatories. Since the

inception of the project, MVCD has reached out to the partners in the agreement, the Mineral County Road Department, the Mineral County Commissioners, and the University of Nevada Cooperative Extension for information about existing populations of noxious weeds. There isn't much

noxious weed data available. This year the Friends of Nevada Wilderness completed a project to lay down existing open post mining claim markers for bird safety around the perimeter of the Gabbs Valley Range Wilderness Study Area. This proposal was approved by the partners of the agreement. MVCD began inventorying for noxious weeds on BLM lands in April, and this inventory process continues as time allows. To date MVCD has found several noxious weed populations but over many square miles of

territory. Invenergy reached out to MVCD for an herbicide retreatment of the solar site in November, 2019. A contract was agreed upon to begin in February, but the necessary signatures had not been obtained prior to the Covid 19 pandemic shut down in March, 2020. To date, MVCD has received no further correspondence.
