The Annual Work Plan and Annual Budget for the Mason Valley Conservation District (MVCD) were reviewed and approved on May 23, 2017.

Natural Resource Priorities and Goals:

• Improve the condition of all natural resources (water, air, soil, vegetation and animal) provide landowners with financial and technical assistance to increase water resource quantity and quality through river channel maintenance and bank stabilization; reduce nonpoint source pollution; reduce energy demands; develop alternative energy sources; reduce fire potential; improve grazing management; improve sage grouse habitat; provide fuels reduction/education; provide technical assistance wherever possible: and provide



- assistance to land planning agencies
- Invasive and Noxious Weeds Mason Valley Conservation District in partnership
 with the Smith Valley Conservation District and the Walker River Basin Cooperative
 Weed Management Area will continue a comprehensive noxious weed inventory,
 mapping and management on the Walker River and its tributaries; inventory, map, and
 treat noxious weeds in Northern Nevada; and assist private landowners with noxious
 weed management
- Walker River Channel Improvement MVCD in partnership with Walker River
 Irrigation District, Nevada Department of Wildlife, and adjacent landowners will seek
 funding to continue the efforts begun in 2015 to remove sediment, improve the stability
 of the Walker River channel, and work toward improved fishery and wildlife habitat





Project Name: Walker Riverbank Stabilization Mitchell Location

In the summer of 2016, Mason Valley Conservation District (MVCD) was made aware of a riverbank failure on the west fork of the Walker River near the site of the Clements stabilization project. The failure was 680 feet long on the west bank with a 12 foot vertical wall, and 50 feet long on the east bank just downstream with a 10 foot vertical wall. The river was threatening to breech an irrigation canal on the west, and wash out a fence on the east. MVCD was able to secure a grant from the Nevada Department of Environmental Protection, Bureau of Water Pollution Control (NDEP BWPC) to stabilize these riverbanks. To date, the cultural survey and historical survey have been completed. The Army Corps of Engineers permit has been through a first draft, and the Army Corps application will soon be complete. The record snowfall from the winter of 2016-2017, and the subsequent flood stage runoff beginning in January and continuing through the summer have caused more erosion, and additional losses to the properties adjacent to the river. The irrigation canal that was threatened has been lost. A new canal was dug further back from the river, and it too has been breeched. The fence on the east side was moved back in the spring, and it has also been undermined and has been moved twice more to date. MVCD received the final engineering design in July, 2018, and plans to contract for construction in early fall. MVCD hopes to complete construction in December 2018.



The Nevada Department of Wildlife (NDOW) granted funding to the Mason Valley Conservation District (MVCD) in October, 2017, to inventory, remove, and treat tamarisk with herbicide on the Mason Valley Wildlife Management Area (MVWMA). MVCD worked through the winter after duck season to accomplish this project without impacting the normal operations of the Wildlife Management Area. MVCD inventoried 71.3 acres,

In cooperation with the Nevada Association of Conservation Districts (NvACD), Mason Valley Conservation District has implemented a Resource Needs Assessment for the entire Conservation District boundaried area. We hope to use this assessment to identify opportunities for District funding that we have not previously pursued, and also to enhance our relationship with Natural Resources Conservation Service. This enhanced relationship may also help the District to partner with NRCS and their clients when implementing **Environmental Quality Incentives Program** (EQIP) contracts. NvACD has received a grant to help fund personnel to research and prepare the assessments for the District, and the District is providing mapping and data support to that indi-

Normal Business

In September, 2017, the Mason Valley Conservation District approved the Annual Report and Final Financial Report. Through the course of the year, the board approved the Resource Needs Assessment, a noxious weed grant from the Nevada Department of Agriculture, and a change to the District's insurance to join the POOL/PACT program under the umbrella of Nevada Association of Conservation districts (NvACD).

On January 23, 2018, the Conservation District held a joint meeting with the Smith Valley Conservation District at the Heyday Inn in Smith Valley. The meeting was well attended, and featured guest speakers Maggie Orr, NvACD President, Rick Orr, and Gary McCuin gave a presentation on Resource Needs Assessments (RNA). Ray Dotson, the NRCS Nevada State Conservationist is supporting the Conservation Districts in Nevada with a \$3,000 financial incentive to prepare a RNA for the District. The incentive is for the first six Districts to commit to a RNA development. MVCD voted to move forward with a RNA at their February 20, 2018 meeting.

MVCD held regular business meetings on:

September 26, 2017, February 20, 2018, May 22, 2018, and June 19, 2018.

Project Name: Luning Energy Invasive Weeds

In December, 2016, Luning Energy Inc. completed construction on their 50 megawatt solar energy plant just northwest of Luning, Nevada. In January, 2018, Liberty Utilities from Lake Tahoe, the new owner of the facility, approached the Mason Valley Conservation District (MVCD) about treating the site for annual invasive weeds. The District evaluated the site and prepared an estimate which was approved in February, 2018. MVCD began

spraying in mid-February to get a pre-emergent herbicide applied before the annual weeds started germination. This time of year the weather is not as cooperative. Temperature and wind limited our on-site treatment time on any given day. The site is set up with tracking

bars to move the panels with the sun, and these bars are in the center of each row of panels. Consequently, the quad-mounted sprayers had to be backed in to the center of the row, and then driven out to spray, which doubled the time required to cover the ground. The entire project covered approximately 320 acres. We completed the project April 15, 2018. Follow-up monitoring has shown the project to be very successful.

Project Name: Walker Basin Conservancy, Flying M Noxious Weeds

The Walker Basin Conservancy (WBC) contracted the Mason Valley Conservation District (MVCD) to treat noxious weeds on the Flying M and Ninemile Ranch properties. These actives specifically relate to National Fish and Wildlife Foundation (NFWF) and Walker Basin Conservancy (WBC) goals in the Walker River Basin for restoration efforts of retired farmland as a result of their water acquisitions in an attempt to restore Walker Lake. Because of record snowfall the winter of 2016-17, there was higher water

flow in the river, making most of the river corridor inaccessible. There was excessive surface water on many of the fields, making it inappropriate for use of some herbicides. MVCD was able to work with WBC and the grazing operator to coordinate weed spraying activities in areas that weren't being actively grazed, irrigated, or impacted by the surface water. Most of the treated area was in former cultivated lands that have been fallowed. Subsequently, noxious and invasive weeds have begun to take hold.
