- 5. Increase public awareness of their conservation district via increasing community attendance at meetings.
- 6. Generate a newsletter(s) for distribution to producers and community.
- 7. Pursue funding, development and implementation for Sage Grouse Initiative
- 8. Identify and pursue grant funding opportunities consistent with conservation objectives in conjunction with item #3.
- 9. Maintain the producer data base.

Amplification of projects: 2016-2017

### NYE COUNTY WEED CONTROL PARTNERSHIPS

The TCD will continue noxious and invasive weed control assistance. The TCD will utilize Tri-County Weed Control, and provide producers with cost-share initiatives that assist them with weed control efforts.

### PROMOTE AND SUPPORT LOCAL, STATE AND NATIONAL PROGRAMS

The TCD will continue to support the Nevada Youth Range Camp program which is held in June. In past years, the TCD has provided a scholarship for Nye County resident youth to participate in the camp experience. TCD commits to support the NvACD, NACD, NRCS and DCNR by attending meetings, providing funding, membership dues and/or other support to these partners.

## PROVIDE EDUCATION AND ASSISTANCE TO PRODUCERS

The TCD will provide education outreach and program assistance to producers in its service area. TCD provides for a contracted employee to provide individualized services for producers. The TCD will provide hands on assistance with producers for completing, filing and following up on Farm Bill Program applications.

### BLM AND RAC/US FOREST SERVICE PROJECTS FOR 2016-2017

TCD will monitor TCD/BLM pass-through funds for projects during 2016-2017. (Should more funding become available from the RAC/US Forest Service the TCD will monitor those pass-through projects as well) The TCD has received funding from the BLM for on-going weed treatment in the district. The TCD has partnered with Tri-County Weed in Ely, NV to provide the services for the agency. The TCD will provide matching funds along with shared costs from the participants.

### NEWSLETTER

The TCD will develop, print and distribute a newsletter to producers at least annually to create awareness of the district itself, programs and opportunities.

### **GRANT FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES**

The TCD Staff & Board members have begun to identify projects at their meetings through workshops and pursue appropriate grant applications consistent with conservation objectives. The TCD has also been reaching out to other agencies for project ideas and opportunities in the district area in need of conservation assistance.

### SAGE GROUSE INITIATIVES

The TCD will continue to actively participate in the pursuit of implementation of Sage Grouse Initiative practices within the district and will continue to liaise with the relevant agencies in pursuit of the same.

### **PRODUCER DATA BASE**

The TCD staff will continue to update and expand to the producer data base.

### TCD ADMINISTRATION

The TCD understands and agrees to comply with all applicable requirements and regulations and agrees to appropriately manage all fiscal responsibilities. TCD also agrees to perform its administrative duties as required.

# Tonopah Conservation District Annual Report September 30, 2017

The Tonopah Conservation District continues to coordinate with and support NRCS, DCNR, USDA, BLM, USFS, FSA, NDOW and other agencies to disseminate program information and development to producers via email, newsletters and meetings. The Tonopah Conservation District together with the Northern Nye Cooperative Weed Management Area (NNCWMA) supports and helps coordinate weed abatement projects on both public and private lands, with treatments administered by Tri County Weed Control and funded by the BLM.

Current staffing of the Tonopah Conservation District is comprised of:

Lorinda Wichman, Chairman of the TCD and Nye County Commissioner Anthony Perchetti, Vice Chairman Richard Reason, Supervisor Tom Seley, Supervisor Donna Otteson, Supervisor Jerry Elliston, Supervisor Susan Wharff, Administrative Assistant

All of the above listed members and staff also reside as members of the NNCWMA.

From July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017 the TCD/NNCWMA conducted 6 meetings over this time period. All meetings were properly posted, advertised, minutes recorded and transcribed in accordance with the open meeting law. All required financial reports were completed and offered to NRCS, DCNR and the BLM as required by the State and BLM Weed Grant program. The TCD also includes 30-60 minute workshops at each meeting to discuss projects and application of those projects. These workshops are included and posted with meeting notices as well as the newspaper advertisements.

Phase III of the Sage Grouse initiative project for the Pasco Canyon area is underway and in the planning stages. The \$ 11,000.00 RAC grant application was submitted in August 2016 and approved. The TCD has partnered with the USFS on Phase III of this project to continue the Sage Grouse Initiative efforts as well as helping other wildlife in the area through Pinion Juniper (PJ) removal.

The Morgan Creek Ranch Project (private land) was submitted as a project proposal for the Competitive Sage-grouse 2017 grant in February 2017. The project was approved and the TCD was awarded \$ 7,191.80. The project is in the early stages and currently coordination efforts are being made with the Nevada Department of Forestry (NDF) who has been contracted to do the labor and tree removal. Transects were done as required by a representative from DCNR via Lauren Williams.

In November 2016 the TCD held their mass election meeting. The TCD had 2 vacancies and Donna Otteson was nominated to fill one of the vacancies. The TCD continued efforts to fill the second vacancy and was successful in May of 2017 and Jerry Elliston was appointed to the second vacancy.

The TCD is currently working on their next project Barley Creek/Monitor Valley and has taken the first step which was to map and inventory the area. That has now been completed through Jerry Elkins of CNGIS who contributed his time and efforts to the Tonopah Conservation District. The USFS picked up half of Mr. Elkins fee in the amount of \$ 820.00. Mr. Elkins donated the remaining balance of \$ 820.00 to the TCD as in- kind services. The project is now ready for a NEPA study and a date should be determined in the near future.

The TCD sponsored 2 Nevada Youth Range Camp participants from Round Mountain, NV. area for 2017. The Society for Range Management operates the week-long camp for 14-18 year olds from Nevada and California. The TCD supports this camp through sponsorships every year.

The TCD published a Spring/Summer Newsletter and was distributed to our producers and public as well. (Newsletter attached).

The Tonopah Conservation District and CWMA meeting information, agenda's and minutes are included on the Nye County Website for ease of access by the public and producers who wish to obtain past meeting information as well as the next meeting information and location.

All operations have been conducted within the district budget and outreach to producers and community is ongoing.
