The following constitutes the Owyhee CD Annual Plan of Work for the 2016 fiscal year ending June 30, 2016.

Mission Statement

The function of the Owyhee Conservation District is to take available technical, financial, and educational resources, whatever their source, and focus or coordinate them so that they meet the needs of the local land user for conservation of soil, water, and related resources.

Planning and Service

Provide for involvement of other agencies, organizations and individuals in the annual planning and implementation of district operations and programs.

1. Identify and prioritize resource concerns within the District in order to coordinate with the NRCS in resource planning and program implementation.
2. Continue cooperation with the NRCS on the snow survey program. Continue efforts to install an automated aerial marker near the Van Norman Ranch and Indian Creek.
3. Provide support for the Farm Bill Programs.
4. Continue cooperation with all agencies on water quality problems when identified within the District.
5. Encourage the NRCS to develop Order 2 soil surveys on irrigated and intensively used lands and to initiate soil surveys on USFS lands.
6. Provide technical assistance to land users on planning and implementation of conservation practices.
7. Assist NRCS on outreach programs to insure that all land users are aware of available assistance.

Noxious Weed Program

1. Continue the Noxious Weed Control Program within the District.
2. Implement a record keeping system using GPS to track weed spraying efforts.
3. Continue rehabilitation projects along county road right of ways where weed spraying has been successful. (i.e. from Mori Ranch to IL mailbox and along Tuscarora roadways)
4. Work with BLM and USFS to continue weed management.
5. Participate in the Humbolt River Watershed Cooperative Weed Management Area with their cooperative efforts related to noxious weed control program.
6. Coordinate with the Northeastern Nevada Stewardship Group on the Tuscarora Fuels and Weed Management Plan and implement practices within the plan.

Equipment Program

1. Provide a district equipment program that will benefit cooperators in implementing conservation practices.

Information and Education Program:

1. Sponsor interested participants to the annual Range Camp.
2. Provide assistance to schools within the District on conservation education as requested.
3. Cooperate with the Great Basin College Agriculture Department for sites used for classroom programs if needed.
4. Continue scholarship program for students within the Owyhee CD.
5. Support the NV College of Agriculture, Biotechnology, and Natural Resources.
6. Participate in the elk management plan for western Elko County.
7. Provide input into the local sage grouse management plan.
8. Participate and provide input into the local feral (wild) horse management plan.
9. Support the Nevada Sagebrush Ecosystem Council and participate in projects as funds permit.

Management and Administration:

1. Pay dues to NvACD and support the annual state meeting to be held in Ely in November 2015.
2. Hold regular meeting to which all cooperating agencies are invited.
3. Contribute to the Elko County Association of CD's clerical fund.
4. Submit all reports and financial statements to the Nevada Division of CD's by the due date.
5. Review Memorandums of Agreements with cooperating agencies each year.
6. Provide representation at NvACD State and regional meetings and other meeting to keep supervisors informed on activities affecting the district and provide input for decision making for locally led conservation.
7. Contact elected representatives as needed for conservation program support.

PLANNING FOR SERVICE

The Owyhee CD maintained active status with the Nevada State Conservation Commission by holding the required meetings and submitting all required documents.

District Goals were continued as follows:

1. Continued actively spraying noxious weeds along the county road right of ways and as many infestations as possible.
2. Implemented reseeding projects along county road right of ways where weed spraying has been successful. Seed was purchased and seeding planned for fall.
3. In the process of implementing a record keeping system using GPS to track weed spraying efforts.
4. Participated in the Humboldt Watershed CWMA and attended the Elko County Weed Summit.
5. Increased participation in CD operations as a means to be proactive in all phases of resource management.
6. Active in the Elko County Association of Conservation Districts by attending meetings.
7. Continued the District's Equipment Program to benefit the cooperators. Continued Memorandums of Understanding with Elko County and multi-agencies for a cooperative Noxious Weed Control Program.
8. Cooperated with the NRCS on the Snow Survey program.
9. Tuscarora cooperative Fire and Weed Management Plan.
