- B. UNR-College of Agriculture Biotechnology and Natural Resources Dr. Sherm Swanson, Range and Riparian Extension State Specialist for University of Nevada Cooperative Extension and Scientist for Nevada Agricultural Experiment Station Commissioner Swanson said there was a Wild Horse Event in Reno last night with about 250 people attending. There was a panel that had Steve Foree, James Sedinger, Celeste Carlisle, Tina Nappe, and Alan Shepherd. Jeremy Drew was the moderator and the video "Horse Rich and Dirt Poor" was shown. Then there was discussion among the panel and questions from the audience.
- C. Natural Resources Conservation Service Ray Dotson, State Conservationist There was no report today.
- D. Nevada Department of Wildlife Bobby Jones, NDOW/NRCS shared Habitat Biologist Bobby Jones said the fire season this year was much less that last year. We are continuing with rehab efforts on the Martin Fire and the Corta fire. Tomorrow in the Winnemucca area BLM and NDOW will be spraying acreage with herbicide spray.

Commissioner Orr said the Lincoln County CD would like an NDOW representative to attend their meetings, local work groups, and focus groups because there is a lot going on. Would he deliver the message because we would like NDOW's input. Bobby said Moira Kolada is in the Ely Area and he will ask her.

Bobby said the interlocal agreements have brought money for CD projects and have been effective.

- E. Nevada Association of Conservation Districts Connie Lee, Executive Director There was no report today.
- F. Sagebrush Ecosystem Technical Team *Kelly McGowan, Program Manager* Bettina said she attended Ethan Mower's Greater Sage Grouse Adaptive Management Trigger Summary Workshop. The SETT would like local input about these triggers, like wildfires in the last ten years and different lek responses and to see how this relates to populations in the area. They will compile that input for specific areas based on habitat by February. Please submit the one page response. Commissioner Tibbitts attended the Battle Mountain Workshop for the South Central Area. Adaptive Management is important and CD's can start the talk. Bettina said Melany Aten has been helping in the North Central Area. Melany said they are working with the LAWGs and CDs. Melany and Ethan may host a workshop for that area.
