

ANNUAL WORK PLAN
STILLWATER CONSERVATION DISTRICT
JULY 1, 2013 – JUNE 30, 2014

Objective 1: Provide quality service to our Conservation District members and conservation partners.

Goal 1: Carryout Administrative Procedures.

Action Item 1: Hold District Board meetings at least once per quarter. Special meetings will be held as necessary.

Action Item 2: Meetings will be held in accordance with Nevada Open Meeting Laws.

Action Item 3: Meeting minutes will be submitted to the Conservation Commission quarterly.

Goal 2: Set Goals and Measure Accomplishments.

Action Item 1: Annual work plan will be developed each spring and submitted to the Conservation Commission by June 1.

Action Item 2: Annual work plan will be reviewed periodically at Board meetings.

Action Item 3: Annual report will be prepared and submitted to the Conservation Commission by September 1.

Goal 3: Manage Equipment Program and Finances to Fund District Activities.

Action Item 1: Develop an annual budget for submission with annual work plan by June 1.

Action Item 2: Annual summary of income and expenditures will accompany annual report.

Action Item 3: District will review cooperator dues and equipment rental rates annually.

Action Item 4: Equipment program will be reviewed and status of equipment repair and maintenance will be determined.

Action Item 5: Equipment will be replaced as funds allow.

Action Item 6: Spend \$2,000.00 for the noxious weed program.

Objective 2: Support a strong conservation partnership with District cooperators, conservation partners, elected officials, agencies, and groups in order to provide technical assistance and information on conservation issues.

Goal 1: Develop Strong Working Relationships with Organizations and Agencies.

Action Item 1: Work with US Fish & Wildlife Service and Conservation District biologist to improve wildlife habitat, prevent erosion, and control weeds on private lands and on lands in the Stillwater area acquired by Fish & Wildlife Service.

Action Item 2: Work with and support Churchill County Cooperative Weed Management Area.

Action Item 3: Maintain regular contact with government agencies and elected officials.

Action Item 4: Represent the District at meetings. Participation in NvACD, Pacific Region, and NACD annual meetings is encouraged.

Goal 2: Develop a Strong Conservation Education and Information Program.

Action Item 1: Review NRCS conservation farm plans for approval, ensuring provisions of Farm Bills are met.

Action Item 2: Work with landowners preparing to transfer water rights to other uses, encouraging conversion of less productive, more salt-affected soils in order to protect prime and important farm lands.

Action Item 3: Support Ag in the Classroom -and provide publications for teachers and students.

Action Item 4: Sponsor one high school student to Nevada Youth Range Camp.

Action Item 5: Sponsor the NACD poster contest with Lahontan Conservation District.

Action Item 6: Submit news articles and press releases on items of special interest to local newspaper.


Goal 3: Provide Technical Guidance Concerning Conservation.

Operation & Events

The board members met every other month this year to discuss programs and conservation concerns. Meetings were held in the conference room at the Agricultural Service Center, 111 Sheckler Road in Fallon, Nevada.

The District complied with the requirements of the Conservation Commission by submitting agendas, minutes, budgets and annual reports.

Stillwater Conservation District had eighteen dues paying cooperators involved in District programs.



The Stillwater Conservation District joined with the Lahontan Conservation District to put on the Annual Summer Barbeque, and the Election and Christmas dinners.

Lyle de Braga and Jackie Bogdanowicz attended the Nevada Association of Conservation Districts annual meeting on November 5 and 6, 2014, where conservation stories and ideas were shared.

District Programs

The district has continued to manage a successful Equipment Rental Program. Ronnie Lawrence is the Equipment Manager, who takes care of the maintenance and repairs. The District Rental Equipment includes a No-Till Drill, Dump Truck, Backhoe, and Grader. The No-Till Drill is a conservation tool that allows farmers to replant without working the ground, which saves labor, fuel, and water. The equipment rental income totaled \$3,391.70 for 2013-2014.



The district used \$1,995.00 of the State's Funding for the Noxious Weed Program. Sixteen landowners received two and a half gallons of 2,4-D Broadleaf Herbicide and two and a half gallons of AquaMaster herbicide. They also received one quart of surfactant. Noxious weeds that were treated included: knapweed, puncture vine and perennial pepperweed.

Education



The district has continued the goal of educating students about the importance of conserving natural resources in Nevada. This year Stillwater Conservation District sponsored Heather Hancock and Trey McGowan to attend the Nevada Youth Range Camp which was located at the U.S. Forest Service Big Creek Campground held in June.

The Stillwater Conservation District also donated \$150 to the Nevada 4-H Livestock Judging Team to help fund their trip to the National 4-H Livestock Judging Contest in Denver Colorado in the month of January.

The district also was active in supporting Ag in the Class in Churchill County. They donated \$200 to Ag in the Class to help fund a World of Corn trailer and supply work books for kids attending ag in the class.

Stillwater Conservation District received \$3,629.62 from the State of Nevada and \$3,500.00 from Churchill County to help in conservation practices.
