- 45 5. Review FY25 Sage grouse grant submissions for funding awards. (For Possible

- 47 a) Review and discussion on the grading and submissions for SCC Sage grouse grant48 FY25.
- b) Select application/s to be awarded for determine funding amount for each award.
- 50 The Commission reviewed sage grouse applications from Eureka CD, Lincoln CD and
- 51 Northeast Elko CD. Each application was graded and scored by an outside committee.
- 52 **Those scores were provided to the Commission for review.** Materials attached at end of
- 53 minutes. The Commission had conversation about inviting Dr Coates regarding habitat
- 54 *improvements on pivots and ask NDOW about Raven control options for landowners.*
- 55 **Commissioners discussed the mowing in the Lincoln CD application and discussion**
- 56 was had regarding the hard lines versus a mosaic of mowing across the habitat. The
- 57 **Commission requested that if funded the brush should be treated in a mosaic pattern.**

- 60 following levels Lincoln CD for \$27,956.94, Northeast Elko CD for \$20,000 and Eureka

- 63 Eureka application funding but disclosed for the record that he (Jake Tibbitts) did not
- 64 have any personal gain from the application or the funding of the application. The
- 65 affiliation with the Eureka CD application did not affect his vote. Commissioner Smith
- 66 abstained from the vote due to possible conflict of interest in the award and possible
- 67 benefits to private property related to funding. ACTION TAKEN

93	8. Updates from Agencies and Partners:

95	a) Nevada Department of Agriculture
96	Commissioner Brown gave updates about the contract grow-out program offered by
97	NDA, four applications were accepted and funded this year, and information will be
98	provided to the growers about the program moving forward to encourage more
99	growers.
100	Commissioner Brown gave an update about the grasshopper and cricket outreach
101	efforts being made and said they have been giving regional updates. The reporting
102	forms are found online on the NDA page, or by contacting Jeff Knight or Meghan
103	Brown. The reporting forms help keep local information current for the NDA staff and
104	help determine areas of treatment. NDA needs more reporting early on from
105	communities to strategically approach treatment options.
106	Commissioner Reiman asked about treatment on public lands.
107	Commissioner Brown replied to treatment on public lands is possible but required
108	permitting in place to be effective in timing.

110	b) University of Nevada Reno/ University Cooperative Extension
111	Commissioner Meiman gave an update about new staff and provided a UNCE newsletter
112	introduction of all the new staff. This is attached at the end of the minutes.

114	c) Natural Resources Conservation Service

None 115 116 d) Department of Conservation and Natural Resources 117 NDEP Mr. Fritzen gave an update regarding the grants available to CDs and an 118 overview. They are looking for watershed planning or watershed improvement projects, 119 this can include upland vegetation projects and riparian projects, and could address issues like runoff, turbidity, erosion and other natural resource concerns. The match is 120 121 one to one currently, but they are looking at ways to remove match. 122 123 e) Nevada Conservation District Program Ms. Aten from the program gave a brief update about civil rights training and diversity 124 125 and inclusion training she is taking to become a Diversity and Inclusion Liaison for the Program and the SCC. 126 127 Ms. Aten also noted there is a need for updated Open meeting law training for CDs and the SCC and Civil rights training. She will be working with DCNR and DAG staff to look 128 into training videos and options for CDs and the SCC. 129 130 f) Sagebrush Ecosystem Program & Sagebrush Ecosystem Technical Team 131 132 The SETT staff gave an update about the meeting taking place tomorrow 7/31 and noted it will have a livestream option. They have a fully staffed team now and notes they can 133 help with permit renewals with BLM and are looking for conservation projects for the 134 135 credit system. 136 137 g) Nevada Association of Conservation Districts Commissioner Martin gave and update about the NVACD meeting taking place 138 November 19-20th and encouraged the SCC and partners to contact CDs and get 139 supervisors registered and involved. He gave an overview of the topics and said the 140 meeting would be in coordination with Nevada weed management association this year. 141 142 Mr. Piper with NVACD gave an overview of the topics and schedule noting the training 143 and speaker meeting will be on Tuesday and the Tours on Wednesday. 144 145 The Program will re-send the NvACD save the date as requested by the commission. 146 147 h) All Other Partners and participating agencies The USFWS Partners Program gave a brief update noting the new field staff supervisor 148

was hired and would be announced soon. They have been reviewing and submitting
 projects under the IRA funding.
