2. Public Comments:

47	3. Review and consideration of approval of November 21st, 2024, agenda: (For
48	Possible Action) Any items that need to be taken out of order, edited, or removed may
49	be proposed for consideration at this time.
50	
51	Commissioner Orr made a motion to accept the agenda as presented, Commissioner
52	Smith second. Motion passed unanimously. ACTION TAKEN
53	
54	4. Review and consideration of approval of meeting minutes: (For Possible Action).
55	Approval of minutes from July 30th, 2024.
56	
57	Chairman Tibbitts noted there is clarification needed on lines68-70. The clarification is
58	corrected to now read "Chairman Tibbitts voted on the approval of funding which
59	included the Eureka application funding but disclosed for the record that he (Jake
60	Tibbitts) did not have any personal gain from the application or the funding of the
61	application. The affiliation with the Eureka CD application did not affect his vote.
62	Commissioner Smith abstained from the vote due to possible conflict of interest in the
63	award and possible benefits to private property related to funding. ACTION TAKEN"
64	Chairman Tibbitts noted a few spelling errors, but no other changes in content
65	presented in the minutes.
66	Commissioner Orr made a motion to accept the minutes as corrected, Commissioner
67	Damron second. Motion passed unanimously. ACTION TAKEN
68	
69	5. <u>Discussion and Review of the Conservation Districts' Annual Reports: (For</u>
70	Discussion Only) Review and discussion of all Conservation Districts' Proposed
71	Budgets and Proposed Work Plans, and the Final Financial Reports and Annual
72	Reports (NAC 548.110).
73	Chairman Tibbitts noted these were provided to the commission in advance for review
74	and consideration.
75	Ms. Aten noted that there were a few corrections to the online posted review sheet, the
76	updated sheet was presented in person and in the meet packet. The noted changes
77	were that Big Meadow CD did spend all their state awarded funding, and this was just
78	an error in their fiscal report. Ms. Aten verified the spending through checks written by
79	the district.
80	Another update was that Esmeralda CD did spend all their allocated state funding, and
81	the fiscal records were lost in the mail, but received shortly before the meeting. The

- 82 Board Chair also verified the full amount was spent by the CD.
- 83 The only district who was unable to show their full spending was White Pine CD, they
- were short by \$745 of spending their \$4,500 awarded.
- 85 Chairman Tibbitts noted that the boards are still not budgeting for the full amount
- 86 expected from that State. It would be good to ensure they are putting the correct
- 87 amount in the proposed fiscal reports.
- 88 Chairman Tibbitts noted some reports are signed by staff such as district managers, but
- 89 not the chairman. It is fine if the district managers sign at the direction of the board, but
- 90 how can the commission be sure the board is reviewing the documents and approving
- 91 them, not just the employees. Ms. Aten noted that in a few instances where employees
- 92 are signing CD staff are present at all annual meetings where these plans are drafted,
- and that the boards have review the information and are requesting the employees sign
- 94 the completed documents for submission. The template also only asks for a signature,
- 95 not the Chairmans signature. But that can be changed if the commission would like to
- 96 ensure the chairman's review before submission.
- 97 Also note the approved-on date at top of form is also missing the date.
- 98 Chairman Tibbitts noted that the incorporated cities and county reps are still missing
- 99 representatives on their boards. Mostly the cities are missing their appointee. He asked
- that we provide support to the CDs and engage with the cities to ask for representation
- 101 on the boards.

- 102 Ms. Aten will update the vacant seats on the summary page for the next meeting.
- 103 Commissioner Orr suggested CDs can suggest to the cities and counties who they
- would like to have sit in the representative's seat. This might be a good way to start
- 105 filling vacancies on boards.

6. <u>Determination of Districts "In Good Standing" for FY24", and decision on release of FY25" funding. (For Possible Action) List of those Districts that meet the criteria of "Good Standing" based on submissions. NAC 549 110</u>

- 111 Chairman Tibbitts noted that all districts are in good standing and that they do not have
- to spend all their state funding to be found in good standing, but they will be awarded
- less money from the state if that spending is not full obligated.
- 115 a) Commissioner Smith made a motion to find all the Conservation Districts in good
- standing, Commissioner Orr second.
- Discussion: Commissioner Orr thanked the CD Program staff for helping get all the
- 118 districts in good standing.
- 119 Motion passed unanimously. ACTION TAKEN

b) Commissioner Reiman made a motion to award all CD their state funding of \$5000 except for White Pine CD which will be awarded \$4,246 and the remainder of \$754 will be split among the other 27 districts, Commissioner Orr second. Motion passed unanimously. ACTION TAKEN

7. Updates from Agencies and Partners: (For Discussion Only)

a) Nevada Department of Agriculture

None- thank you to NDA for allowing us to use their meeting room for the SCC meeting.

b) <u>University of Nevada Reno/ University Cooperative Extension</u>

Holly Gatzke: Our realignment of our staffing is coming. We have several of the 132 133 counties, not all of them staffed with what we're calling an extension coordinator, right 134 now they are covering Eureka, White pine, Lander, Lyon County, Churchill, Pershing 135 and Mineral. I'm really thrilled that we've been able to hire people that are energetic, 136 positive, know how to and their jobs. These positions are to be connections with the 137 community, manage the office and bring in programming to diversify what's happening in that area and support any experts that are in the area. UNCE has taken the extension 138 educator position and kind of split it in 2 instead of hiring somebody with all the 139 expertise and asking them to take care of an office and do all these other things. UNCE 140 141 is hiring people to do that in clusters and then having educators like Gary McCuine 142 spend 100% of his time is now AG and natural resources education, this has proven to be successful.

Tracy Shane was hired on as the extension livestock specialist. Andrew Waaswa, located in Fallon was brought on as an extension educator in crop and soil health.

c) Natural Resources Conservation Service

Chris Rose: noted there were several NRCS updates over the last few days at the annual meeting, and the NvACD business meeting. He noted a few things that were not mentioned at those updates include: One of NRCS's priorities is to ensure NRCS employees and DCs are attending all CD meetings moving forward.

- 152 Commissioner Orr asked about small acreage fund pool.
- 153 Mr. Rose noted this was discussed at the STAC and that he would check into those fund
- pools to see if that was addressing in the funding qualifications.
- 155 Commissioner Martin asked about the two fund pools earmarked for Nevada
- specifically, one was NAQI funding and the other CIG funding.

- 157 Mr Rose said yes those are specific to Nevada and will not be competing with national
- 158 for funding. The two priorities in CIG are vegetation management and urban ag.
- 159 The other new funding program is the Nation Air Quality Initiative, with 1.5 million in
- that fund. This program is commonly called the "tractor trade" program. This is the
- upgrading of energy equipment replacing diesel to solar or upgrade an older tractor to a
- 162 **new one.**
- 163 Commissioner Smith asked about upgrading their solar programs in place. Chairman
- 164 Tibbitts noted FSA has a program for this.

- d) **Department of Conservation and Natural Resources**
- 167 Dominique Etchegoyhen; he also noted there were several DCNR updates over the last
- 168 few days at the annual meeting, and the NvACD business meeting, he asked if there
- were any specific requests for information or updates.
- 170 Chairman Tibbitts asked about the budgeting cycle and for information regarding that
- 171 process.
- 172 Mr. Etchegoyhen; each budgeting process is confidential to the department and
- programs, but some general things being discussed are the expectations in this
- budgeting cycle and the feedback requires follow up currently. He noted the department
- does not have unlimited resources to meet the needs, and they can use that opportunity
- to make sure the state is aware of the challenges and needs they face. And so that
- process is that it will go to Gov Rec with the projections in every department and be
- balanced against the economy. The governor's office will balance those needs and
- make appropriate decisions to meet those needs. With the unique position of having Mr
- Settelmeyer as director he can highlight the importance of our program and the CDs.
- 181 There is a lot of support for CD, but it doesn't always come through our budget.

- 183 Commissioner Smith asked about the credit system status.
- 184 Mr. Etchegoyhen: he noted there is more discussion with BLM about NEPA and how the
- process can meet the needs of planning process. The SETT is also looking at the ability
- to generate the credits on public lands and how to work through that process with
- 187 **NEPA.**
- 188 Commissioner Annis: Feedback for Mr. Etchegoyhen, the updates to the DWR website
- 189 have made finding and accessing information much more difficult. He understands it
- 190 will take time to work out some of the bugs, but that the new update has been difficult to
- 191 utilize and wanted to just provide some feedback regarding those updates.
- 192 Mr. Etchegoyhen: I'll pass that information on to our IT team that's continuing to
- 193 develop that

- 194 Commissioner Martin: he asked about the water buy back bill and the new bill being
- 195 introduced currently.
- 196 Mr. Etchegoyhen: The bill was used in the first year to gauge interest and it was
- 197 successful so there has been another bill which would be the continuation of the
- 198 program. It may be SB36 and would allow for the buy back program to continue.

- 200 Chairman Tibbitts mentioned the new program is being introduced as a voluntary water
- retirement program versus a strict buyback program which is a cut and paste of SB176.
- 202 But there's a separate bill being called the Omnibus water bill, this is just to stand up
- 203 the program, this is being brought forward by a group of stakeholders, including
- 204 Southern Nevada Water Authority and environmental groups or whatever, that also put
- 205 bill forward to the Natural Resources Committee and it they're very similar in a lot of
- 206 ways, but there's some differences between the two.

e) Nevada Conservation District Program

- Ms. Aten gave thanks to Gerry Miller who will be retiring in January and wanted to note
- 210 how much of an impact and how influential he has been in the success of the CD
- 211 program and keeping the CDs in Elko moving forward in conservation. It will be difficult
- 212 to lose Gerry, and we will miss him.
- 213 The CD program has a vacancy in southern Nevada/ Ely currently and will be opening
- 214 that position and the Elko position early in the new year.
- 215 A quick update on the NAC language introduction. The process was reviewed and
- 216 accepted, and we are now at the point in the process of hosting more meetings to follow
- 217 up with the notice of intent to act upon regulation process. More notifications will be
- coming out the SCC soon to discuss the next steps.
- 219 For CDs specifically our staff will be working on providing training updates this new
- year specifically in diversity, equality and inclusion along with civil rights and open
- 221 *meeting law.*

f) Sagebrush Ecosystem Program & Sagebrush Ecosystem Technical Team

- Casey Adkins: So as Mr. Etchegoyhen stated, we are under a discussion right now with
- our Council on how the version of the tools and the manual that we currently use for all
- our individual projects, when those will be kind of locked in or standardized. So that
- meeting is on December 13th and it's open to the public. And that will go out in our new
- 228 update.
- The SETT will have an updated versions of manual and tools coming out our 2.0 version
- with the New Year, and that version will also have new habitat maps. If any of you all

- use those regularly, those will be on our website, or feel free to reach out to me and I
- can provide those for you, those come from USGS out of Pete Coates lab.
- 233 Additionally speaking to the public lands and the debit mitigation, I'm the public lands
- lead and I'm actively working on building this initiative out and always looking for
- collaborations now I'm looking at supporting debit proponents to actually work on
- 236 mitigation with the BLM office out of the Bristlecone Pine district. We've had some
- 237 interest from debit proponents, but it's still very preliminary right now as there's little
- 238 guidance from the BLM and NEPA yet. So, we are kind of working in conjunction with
- 239 them through this process and understanding the public lands rule.

g) Nevada Association of Conservation Districts

- Kevin Piper: It's been a productive couple of days, and he noted his appreciation for all the people who helped make the annual meeting successful.
- 244 He noted that he is looking forward to the next steps in the NRCS agreement process 245 and helping place staff with CDs and NRCS.

h) All Other Partners and participating agencies

Ms. Aten noted she can add FSA to the partner reporting section to encourage updates to the SCC. But asked the Commission to let her know if there are specific updates they wish to hear, or any individuals from other organization they want to have updates from.

- Chris Fritsen with NDEP: Just wanted to bring people's attention that we do have a
- grant funding opportunity open, it's for watershed planning. No match required on this.
- 254 It's a unique opportunity where we have funding that doesn't require match and the
- 255 watershed planning can get things in place where that might open the doors for some of
- our other funding, which unfortunately still requires match at this time.
- We anticipating anticipate opening another grant funding opportunity within the next
- week or so, about \$800,000 requiring a one to one match. A link with information was
- 259 **provided in the chat.**

- **8.** <u>Commissioner Items (For Discussion Only)</u> Commissioners will provide comments and any reports for the Commission.
- Commissioner Orr: FB is no longer being supported by County Companies which means they will now have to rely on members to help support them.

268	Commissioner Orr also noted that there are two resolutions being provided through
269	NVACD to the national association. One is to ask NRCS to include virtual fencing
270	options in practices. The other is asking NRCS to allow flexibility in contracted
271	practices which don't make sense in the final years of a contract. There are instances
272	where practices are contracted early in the development of the plan and the producers
273	are held to those even when there are better options that come up. This can mean failed
274	installment of practices but do to them being contracted they must be installed.
275	Mr. Rose noted he will be sure to follow up on those conversations related to the
276	resolutions.
277	
278	Commissioner Martin: just an observation that yesterday on NVACD tours of the UNR
279	experimental farm there were some very insightful and helpful work going on which

Commissioner Martin: just an observation that yesterday on NVACD tours of the UNR experimental farm there were some very insightful and helpful work going on which could be very useful to CDs at large. He requested that if we have meetings in these regions where there is an experiment farm with information to share that we host a tour in conjunction with the SCC meetings.

Commissioner Smith: It was very interesting to see the UNR experimental projects. And he asked if UNCE extension still does those experimental tours and encouraged UNCE to continue to provide field days for this kind of learning process.

He also noted all the great work that Gerry has done and noted that working with Gerry was a highlight of his career and appreciates all the work he's done for natural resources and conservation districts, we all thank Gerry for his service and dedication.

Chairman Tibbitts: the upcoming legislative session might have some things to consider for future SCC agendas.

The Soil Health bill was approved by the interim committee and being moved forward to a committee bill. There are multiple water bills being introduced, including the one discussed today. Just a note to pay attention to those bills which may impacts CDs and natural resources.

Commissioner Smith: he asked NvACD and Kevin Piper about CD legislative day and to ensure that is being investigated and booked asap.
